

**There are several ways to pay dues:** ONLINE (*make sure it's POST 52 & not POST 1000*), BY MAIL, IN PERSON, DROP-OFF BOX at our front door or by calling National.

EACH MEMBER (no matter what their level of participation) lets THIS POST continue to help Veterans and their families. Our membership numbers nationwide make an impact when The American Legion speaks before Congress!

Please check the back of your renewal notice. Fill out any blank information, provide corrections to addresses, telephone #s, email addresses, etc. Email is needed because Post minutes are sent out before every general meeting thus shortening the meeting time of being read out loud. A few paper copies will be available at the monthly meeting for those who do not have an email account.

For the last several years, guidance counselors at the various Mountain Home schools have maintained a program where children in need can participate in a Christmas gift program. 

Historically Speaking


The purchase can only be made if we meet the city's requirements for a storage building. More to come on this matter.
